PREDICTING RISK: INNOVATIONS TO IMPROVE HEALTH SERVICES

Jennifer Dixon, director of the Nuffield Trust, has researched and written widely on health care reform and was policy advisor to the Chief Executive of the NHS between 1998 and 2000. She is a board member of the Audit Commission and visiting professor at LSHTM, LSE and Imperial College.

In her lecture she will describe how recent advances allow information on the use of the NHS and social care can be linked to predict risk in three areas relevant to current NHS reforms: allocating resources fairly; sharing financial risk between commissioners; and identifying patients at high risk of using services. These innovations might help reduce avoidable ill health and improve NHS efficiency.
